AUTOMATIC AID

In 2020, the Northwest Fire District, Golder Ranch Fire District, and Tucson Fire Department implemented an Automatic Aid agreement. Through this partnership, the closest available response unit from any of the three departments will respond to a call, regardless of the jurisdictional boundaries. NWFD and GRFD began the partnership in 2015, with TFD joining in 2020.

You will often see crews from the different agencies on Special Operations incidents, like swiftwater and technical rescues, with support units like Air Power Light and Rehab.

When issuing information to the media, NWFD will provide information for incidents in the District's jurisdiction. On major events or incidents, the District will work with TFD and GRFD to provide information.

PREVENTION

The Prevention Services Division is committed to protecting the people and property within the Northwest Fire District from fire and other hazardous conditions through active involvement with our citizens and community partners. This is accomplished through focusing on the development and delivery of comprehensive fire prevention programs including engineering/plans review, fire and life safety inspections, active code enforcement, and fire investigations.

With growth in our District expected to continue throughout 2022, our Fire Inspectors and Plans Examiner are managing an increased workload to keep the future of our community safe.
